Safe, clean youth shelters providing short-term care and a refuge for homeless or runaway youth, along with crisis intervention for families.



#### COUNSELING

Provides counseling to youth ages 6-17 and their families facing conflicts, guiding youth toward success



### AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS

After-school and summer program for ages 6-14, for promoting academic success, resilency and personal growth.



### SNAP (STOP NOW AND PLAN)

13-week program for children ages 6-17 and their parents, teaching emotional regulations, and self-control.



### SAFE2B - YOU & ME

Provides healthy relationship education using an evidencebased curriculum for teens ages 14-18 in community schools and programs

CCF Program reimburses licensed providers for serving nutritious meals to children, supporting healthy growth for young kids.

Offers support services for runaway, homeless, street youth, ages 16-24, to help with housing and personal safety.

To be recognized as the trusted organization for providing safety, support and empowerment to vulnerable children, youth and families.





